# **Recap of Summer 2024**

Thanks to all your prayers, efforts and generous giving, the Lord blessed us tremendously during the 2024 Summer Season ad throughout the year. We had 631 registrations in our Overnight and Day Camp programs and over 450 volunteer staff. Although we were down by nearly 10% in Summer Session registrations, we are up so far over by over 15% for all other Camp events throughout the rest of the year!

As it reminds us several times in the Old Testament, our devotion to God's message at Camp continues to lead to God's multi-generational blessings. We continue to see people attending Camp from the same families into the fourth and fifth generation—attending programs and events, serving as volunteer staff, running our summer Summer Sessions and other Camp events, and even serving as Board Members.

We had 135 first-time campers this summer and awarded over \$18,000 in financial assistance (Campships and other aid) to 109 kids from families that needed financial help in 2024. All of this was

only only possible because of your exceedingly generous financial donations. In fact, through your aid and other income generating events (church retreats, Camp-sponsored retreats, family events, other group camps, and school events), Camp was able to support our Summer Camp program to the tune of over \$150,000 more than the income Camp received from registrations. We also had 2 dozen supporting congregations pay in full or in part for children to attend our Summer Sessions.

During our 2024 Summer Sessions, we continued to have delicious food, Bible classes and memory work, worship and devotionals, Bible buzzer competitions, swimming and creek walks, hiking and fishing, riflery and archery, horseback riding and zip lining, athletics and volleyball, bottle rockets and talent shows, obstacle courses and hikes, senior celebration dinners, and much more.

Thank you from the bottom of our hearts for enabling us to share the love of Christ with so many children and for living out Camp's mission—transforming lives for Christ for a lifetime.

### A Second Family Camp!

Over the last several years, Family Camp over Memorial Day weekend in the Spring has become the most attended Camp event. To find an adequate solution, we have decided to have a second Family Camp over Labor Day weekend in the late summer / early fall. This year, what we call Fall Family Camp was a popular and huge success. 89 people came to Fall Family Camp experiencing all that Family Camp has to offer, including some unique activities, like a crazy photo challenge.

Normally, we have almost 200 people come to Spring Family Camp, so having nearly 90 people attend Fall Family Camp was a huge success. Whenever we start a new event at Camp and have more than 20 people attend the first time, we consider it a success. So, it looks like we blew the doors off the Fall Family Camp!

Just like Spring Family Camp runs concurrently with Camp Open House on Memorial Day Saturday, Fall Family Camp ran concurrently with Staff Appreciation Day, which had over 110 volunteer staffers attend! So we had over 200 at Camp simultaneously during the wildly popular Fall Family Camp weekend.

The new Fall Family Camp director team included Billy Shiplet, Meta Christaldi, Sarah and David Hulick, and Colllin and Moriah Swenson. They did a fantastic job and introduced many new ideas to the Family Camp experience.




